Guest Mooring

The San Luis Yacht Club (SLYC) has one mooring available for *vessels up to 56 feet*. The mooring is located west of the Avila Pier.

- **GUEST MOORING RENTAL FORM: is required** prior to using a SLYC mooring or immediately thereafter.

Guest Rental Agreement Form available: slyc.org/moorings. Once completed, email or text Agreement Form to Port Captain San Filippo. Use of the mooring is subject to the SLYC mooring policies as excerpted below:

LIMITATION OF MOORING CAPABILITIES: The SLYC guest mooring season, April 1 through October 31, and mooring capability is determined by the Port San Luis Harbor District. The SLYC mooring is capable of securing yachts **up** to 56 feet.

ASSIGNMENT OF MOORING: The SLYC Guest Mooring is available to vessels of members of reciprocal yacht clubs visiting Port San Luis, on a “first come – first serve” basis with preference to owners who make a reservation. The maximum stay is fourteen (14) days, which may be divided into two periods of seven days to accommodate a cruising schedule.

MOORING FEES: Visiting members of reciprocal yacht clubs will be allowed to stay the first 24 hours free of charge. Thereafter, the daily rental fee is \$15.00 Payable to SLYC.

LOADING: - Due to the closure of Avila Pier from structural damages - landing on the east side of the Avila Pier (the eastern most pier) is not available for loading and unloading crew and supplies. This includes the dinghy mooring line located on the west side of the pier. If you do not have a dinghy a Port San Luis water taxi is available during day hours contact the Harbor office for additional information specific to times (805) 595-5400. If pier becomes available, use a long painter – at least 45 feet – to be able to pull your dinghy to and from the dinghy mooring line by looping the painter around the line and securing it to the ladder on the west side of the pier.

The SLYC Port Captain, Ken San Filippo handles disputes and is the ultimate authority in decisions regarding mooring assignments. All users agree to abide by the rules of the SLYC and Port San Luis Harbor District. The Port Captain and/or the Port San Luis Harbor Patrol has full authority to require any vessel be removed from the mooring if those responsible for the vessel act in a manner which creates a hazard, disturbs the peace, or bring reproach upon the SLYC.
