Mark your calendar and join us for CLEAN UP DAY Saturday Mar 19 starting at 8am – this is very important so be true blue and join us.

A lot is going on at the Club at the start of the year. Our major current issue is the intermittent failure of the pass card system. Over a dozen members have had their cards rejected and denied access to the club. **Ken San Filippo, Chris Barrett,** and others have devoted a good deal of time trying to trace down the gremlin at the root of it. It is an old out of date software system which is no longer supported. We have brought in a computer consultant and hope to get to the bottom of it soon. We may have to install a new system and replace all of the outstanding pass cards.

If you have something important coming up you should go by and test your card to make sure you are not blocked. If you have a problem please call the Rear Commodore and he can reset your card. Please be patient.

We welcomed our new Board members at the first Director meeting of the year: **Tom Sinnickson, Scott Erwin, Melanie Cleveland,** and **Jim Gilletly.** These folks exemplify the volunteer spirit of the club. It is a lot of work to serve on the Board. You not only have to prepare for and attend the meetings and serve throughout the year as OD, but, additionally, each post has a set of responsibilities that continue throughout the year.

One of our long term goals has been to monitor and manage the volunteer responsibilities of every member. If you have not done so yet, please sign up for your volunteer service in the

Member's Section. While some folks had to be reminded more than once we had remarkable compliance in 2015, the best anyone can remember. Keep in mind that many members have shifted to Associate status – you have no volunteer obligation but you can attend and participate in all club events. This also serves to open up a new membership slot. We have strengthened the requirement and made it more clear in amendments adopted at the last Board meeting: You must serve as a cook for a brunch, dinner, or wet Wednesday, a bar host for two events, or serve on a race committee for two events. Alternatively you can serve in another capacity by providing clubhouse or boat maintenance, serving as a water taxi captain or other service approved by the Vice Commodore. The service is per Flag Membership, so the fact that a member and spouse serve as bar hosts on a certain night, for example, counts as only one service. If you have any questions please contact Vice Commodore Mary Matakovich.

Our major project this year is the remodeling of our bathrooms. We are currently raising funds for the project and a number of members have made \$200 contributions. We ask all of you to contribute and participate in our fundraising program, “the Royal Flush.” Thanks again to **Marty Fuller, Brian Metcalf, Ramon Hopkins,** and others who are planning and leading this program.

The Commodore's dinner in January was a great success. We had a great turnout of former commodores, including **Del Hollinger,** a member since 1946. As part of our outreach policy the 2015 MBYC Commodore, **John Bodine,** and the current Commodore, **Todd Hansen,** attended and had a great time.

New member applicants can attend two Orientation sessions and obtain their applications. The dates can be found in the Calendar. We anticipate as many as 10 openings this year. Remember, the applicant must attend in person accompanied by at least one of their sponsors to obtain an application.

Happy 2016! After ten days sailing around St. Martin it was nice to return home to all the rain. Here's hoping it continues and supports good lake sailing in the upcoming season. Regardless, we have races scheduled at Lake Lopez on February 13, March 6, and April 3. Registration starts at 10 am in the marina car park. The Skipper's meeting will be at 11 am with race start scheduled for noon. Barry (Power Captain), Kristin (Sail Fleet 2nd), and I will reconnoiter the sailing conditions prior to the first race to determine what the best course options are. Volunteers are encouraged to sign up on line for race committee as well as chase boat.

Once the Lake season is concluded we'll be gearing up for the Ocean races. The ocean activity will start with the Hobie Days Regatta, hosted by Hobie Fleet 259. This is always a fun event with two days of racing, 16-17 April. There will be lots of cats and colorful sails out on the water. The cats will launch from the dog beach and the races will be held in the bay. Races will be run from a committee boat. Check out the volunteer sign-up sheet and join us on the water.

With Avila pier remaining closed we are fortunate that Dr. Dean Wendt, Dean of Research and Director of the Center

Technically there are two ocean race series, the Port San Luis Small Boat Cup Series and the Avila Cup Series. Usually we can run the same courses for both and run the races simultaneously. Occasionally though, we'll have an especially good show of Hobies and will have to alternate starts to keep things moving.

Port Report

I would like to introduce myself as this is my first report as Port Captain. My name is Tom Sinnickson, going into my third year as part of the club and I am “one of those Hobie guys.” Over the past four years, my Hobie fleet has been working to increase fleet membership, participation, knowledge, marine access and fun. I joined the SLYC because it seemed that it had a bunch of people doing the same thing.

As most of you already know, the pier is closed, further limiting access to the Bay, specifically our Mooring and Ocean Series race access. Our guest mooring is out there and functional but quite difficult to use at the moment and due to the condition of the pier and the likely cost to repair that doesn't look to change anytime soon. The port is actively seeking financial relief to repair or modify our historic pier in order to restore access to the public.

The other major issue affecting access in San Luis Bay is the availability of the water taxi. Currently with only two

volunteer, water host drivers, the service can become quite impacted during an SLYC race event. The hours may be difficult for early bird fishermen or folks returning late from a Wet Wednesday or other recreational activity. We are currently trying to work out some short term and long term solutions to provide the most appropriate access for boaters without excessively burdening the port. The new interim harbor manager, Andrea Lueker and the new Chief Harbor patrol Officer, Casey Nielsen are receptive to working with us to that end.

In an effort to strengthen our relationship with the port, we have invited the Harbor Patrol to speak at our next Wet Wednesday. This is an opportunity to get information about boat and mooring safety in the port as this year's big storms roll in. This is also an opportunity for some open conversation with some officers about any questions you may have about the port or port regulations. Please come out and help us welcome the officers and kick off this year's Wet Wednesday line up.

Finally, I would like to add a request for input. If you have water taxi stories (good or bad) issues with the port, praises for an officer or other staff member that did something extraordinary, I would like to hear about it. I look forward to getting to know more of you this year and seeing you on the water.

Tribute to Hilde Hollinger

I regret to tell you that my dear wife of 63 years, Hilde, passed away at home on Christmas Eve after a long illness. She and I have been members of the San Luis Yacht Club since 1952, and she was my first mate when I was Commodore in 1965 and 1967.

She was born of German Immigrants in Grand Rapids Michigan in 1930. Her parents, Luise and Henry Eberle, came through Ellis Island soon after WW I, and their names are written on the Island's commemorative wall. In 1937 Hilde along with her sister and mother traveled to Germany; and while there, she attended one of Hitler's schools. Her girlfriend married my brother, and we got acquainted while she was visiting San Luis Obispo. We wrote to each other while I was in the Korean War, and we were married in 1952 after I returned to the U.S.

Hilde was an accomplished seamstress, quilter, square dancer, sailor, singer in the group called "Kindred Spirits" and had an uncanny ability to remember friends' birthdates and anniversaries without writing them down. She worked for San Luis County government as an accountant in the General Services Department and retired in 1985. As my first mate she put up with a lot of regattas and one international flattie championship in Avila Beach. She and I sailed our 29 foot Ericson sloop back and forth to Hawaii in 1989.

Besides me, Hilde is survived by our daughters Lore and Denise, 6 grandchildren, and 3 great grandchildren. She will always be deeply missed.
