



Today, I'm writing my article from the San Luis Yacht Club after returning from the Pacific Sail and Power Boat Show at the Craneway Pavilion and Marine Bay Yacht Harbor, Richmond, CA. Had a great time with Lettie and Marty Fuller and Michael Dobrzensky. We also saw Simon Smith and Adi Ringer at their Remora Solo booth. We enjoyed the show exhibits, talking to vendors, free sailing books/samples, touring sailboats, doing a scavenger hunt (won a sunset cruise!), almost won a Mercury outboard, enjoyed delicious food and great company. Saturday we went out on a 65' Adventure Catamaran trip out of Pier 39 in San Francisco! Great times. I encourage everyone to join the cruising events!

I was out with the SLYC sailors for a windy day on the 3rd Lopez Lake Race in April. I want to big a "Thank You" to **John Diaz** for coming out on short notice to

assist me with the Chase Boat! He was a great help with launching the boat, setting/retrieving race marks, assisting the sailing crew and sailboats. We did a few boats assists, gave a tow and enjoyed being on the water. The Chase boat engine didn't run the best, but we made the best of it and powered through the day. But, wait...I have some good news...The day before I left for the boat show, I took the day off, met with **Barry Stewart** and we worked on the Chase Boat engine all day. In the morning we drained the fuel from the Vapor Separation Tank (VST), flushed the fuel

from the VST and fuel rail, installed the new fuel injectors that Barry previously cleaned/rebuilt, indexed the throttle bodies, cleaned the external Racor fuel/water separator bowl, replaced the engine's internal fuel filter, emptied the old fuel from the main tank and replaced it. That afternoon, we then took the boat to Lopez Lake for on the water test. We ran around the lake for a few hours and I have to say... the Chase Boat ran very well! We were able to maintain 5,000 to 6,000 RPM depending on

the wind/water conditions. I'm very grateful for Barry's help and instruction. And I am happy to say that the Chase Boat is ready for the upcoming Hobie Regatta in Avila Beach for May 2018!

Congratulations to the sailing vessel "Gran Cru" a Catalina 350 and their owners for winning the 2018 SLYC Bristol Award! The Bristol Boat Award is presented to the SLYC fleet boat (and owners) that has maintained their vessel in perfect condition which can be described as "Shipshape and Bristol Fashion." Great Job!

In my role as Port Captain, I have been attending the Port San Luis Harbor Commission meetings and would like to report the following:

Small Boat Program

At its March 2018 meeting, the Harbor Commission unanimously approved our small boat pilot program. This allows us to store two Hobie Wave catamarans under the Yacht Club for member use. While the Commission were unanimous in their approval, there was concern about the safety of launching boats near swimmers. I would like to

commend **Roger Briggs** for representing the small boat program and the interests of the Yacht Club. He did a fantastic job in moving our program forward. If you see him, please thank him!

Avila Pier Update:

The Avila Pier Community Meeting was held at the Yacht Club on March 16. During that meeting, an architectural firm presented three preliminary designs for the pier with estimated construction and on-going costs listed. A questionnaire was distributed to give feedback to the Harbor Commission. The questionnaire contained questions about the preferred length of the pier (including demolition without replacement) and funding options for the pier. Currently, there is no funding for any of the options. I will update you all with the results of the questionnaire once they are made public.



SLO Sloop Update

By the time you read, this our Commodore, Chris Barrett will have spread the good news via Scuttlebutt email.

Your boat committee now has relaunched our Club Flagship, "Slo Sloop", on March 29, when a late morning high tide and calm weather aligned.

Boatmaster **Dan Pease** previously procured all new standing rigging for her. We were waiting for storms to pass and deep water at the sport launch basin to clear the rudder.

We re-rigged her mast in the parking lot at Port, then installed the outboard motor and the rudder, hoisted her off the trailer and touched up the bottom paint.

The volunteers were **Joe Montgomery, Eoin Duffy, David Williams, Dick Strachan, Jim Gilletly, Jeff Bucher** and myself.

David began first at storage and helped me get her to Avila along with fresh fuel, running rigging and her rudder in his truck.

David and myself met Eoin, Dick and Joe at Port, and proceeded to strip the old rigging, install the new rigging, install the furling mechanism on the forestay and find the pieces we removed previously.

Jim, accompanied by his energetic pooch "Holly" organized the cables, re attached the shrouds, and kept the tools in some kind of order.

Jeff's specialty was laying out rigging, threading the furler and final paint touchup as well as keeping our cooler stocked for the warm weather. Jeff also waxed the railwork and wound up all the old rigging.

David and myself loaded and attached the outboard motor, re-locked the safety cable, clamped it down, replaced the emergency fuel, lubed the padlocks and set a pad under the mast for launch.

We then sent her to the work dock for raising the mast and reinstalling the boom, mainsail and accessories.

The four pressed men to raise the mast were Joe, Eoin, David and Jim. After the mast was up, it was wisely decided the furler drum would be better with its line opening facing aft, so the process was reversed and repeated. In the meantime, she was almost rechristened with a barely printable name. Ask the crew what they thought a humorous name for a tempestuous sailboat might be.

The Water Taxi was about to make its 3pm run, and as the boom and mainsail were attached, it was noted that a goose-neck pin was not aboard.

A small bolt was conscripted from standby duty and she was finally under way to her mooring.

Meanwhile, Jeff and Dick had fortified our depleted cooler with cold drinks which were welcomed after nearly five hours of boat work.

Joe volunteered to store the now empty trailer nearby for SLYC and the trailer is laid up close to Avila, parked on concrete instead of dirt.

She is now available for sailing, racing and training in the ancient ways of the mariner.

The casualty list included 2 broken fingernails, 1 bandaid-patched minor "owee", 1 white polo shirt stained and a bit of blue paint here and there.

Thanks heartily to all who assisted in the un-glamorous yet highly nautical tasks of hauling, cleaning, painting, re-rigging and launching of our humble pocket yacht "Slo Sloop".

Thanks to a coordinated effort by our boatmaster Dan Pease and his helpers, "Slo Sloop" is again cruising the waters in front of S.L.Y.C.

Our clubs Catalina 22 suffered a bit of malicious mischief on or about Friday night April 6. Someone likely boarded the starboard side, pulled the mast base bolt, unpinned ALL the turnbuckles, then opened 5 of 7 exposed. The mast tilted to starboard until it caught on the lifeline, and its upper portion was partially submerged. Vice Commodore Stewart and member Tim Waag, working on the clubhouse, responded quickly and pulled it all aboard and secured it until new pins and clips could be obtained.

On Saturday April 21, with \$60 in very small parts, tools etc., the Water Taxi transported Vice Commodore Stewart and Boatmaster Dan Pease to the work dock. Subsequently Eoin Duffy, David Williams and Joe Montgomery went to retrieve "SLO Sloop". We first cleaned the vile work dock of sea lion mess, lashed "SLO Sloop" alongside, then proceeded to move that abused spar back into the preferred vertical position.

After securing, clipping, pinning, taping and a bit of adjusting, we reattached the boom and mainsail plus its control sheet and vang. Feeling nautical, we tidied up the cabin and its contents, installed the sail cover, made a few supply lists, then returned her to her mooring awaiting your recreational or educational use.

Special thanks again to Dan, Tim, Eoin, David and Joe for once more answering the Clubs call for volunteers.
