The year is half over and it's time to start thinking about next year. If you are interested in serving on next year's Board of Directors of the San Luis Yacht Club, we would like to hear from you.

The Board consists of the following elected positions:

**Commodore** – The Chief Executive Officer of the Club.

**Vice Commodore** – Assists the Commodore; responsible for Opening Day events; assigns Officer of The Day and bar hosts for club social events.

**Rear Commodore** – Responsible for the physical aspects of the clubhouse (maintenance, security, key cards); maintains the Club Calendar and club house reservations.

**Secretary** – Writes and maintains Minutes of board meetings; drafts and sends correspondence as needed; maintains the membership database; issues membership cards; orders name tags; sends and receives reciprocals with other yacht clubs.

**Treasurer** – Pays the bills of the club; prepares financial reports; assists the Finance Committee in preparing the yearly budget.

**Port Captain** – Responsible for seasonal moorings; serves as our representative to the Harbor District.

**Sail Fleet Captain** – Chairman of the Race Committee; organizes and conducts ocean and lake sail races.

**Power Fleet Captain** – Assists the Sail Fleet Captain by setting buoy markers for races; provides the SLYC safety boat during races; maintains the safety boat; develops and promotes power boating activities.

**Cruising Captain** – Develops and organizes club cruising activities.

**Directors** (3 elected at large) – each Director serves on committees and functions as appointed by the Commodore.
