- A full calendar of events and most of the time we fill the volunteer assignments
- Our bar bolster and our tables have been repaired and we are about to start a project in the galley


The November Wet Wednesday was a success with over 60 people enjoying Scandinavian themed food including; meatballs, potatoes, lingenberry gravy, and

On October 24th, the FOAP board of directors - Marcia Scott, Ron Pigeon, Judy Kaatz and Mary Matakovich - hosted a sold out, successful event inside the yacht club. The event was sponsored by PGE and SLYC and netted over \$10,000 which will support the ongoing pier renovation and reopening efforts, including boat landing! Donations continue to arrive, reflecting the community's enthusiasm to support the pier. Notably, the Donor Plaque Program, recognizing donors of \$1000 or more with a plaque on the renovated pier, has gained attention.
