Recently I listened to a story on KCBX about a Netflix documentary called Join or Die, "A film about why you should join a club...and why the fate of America depends on it."

On their website, joinordiefilm.com, they explain the film: "In this feature documentary, follow the half-century story of America's civic unraveling through the journey of legendary social scientist Robert Putnam, whose groundbreaking "Bowling Alone" research into America's decades-long decline in community connections could hold the answers to our democracy's present crisis."

One review of the film says, "Join or Die. The phrase harks back to Ben Franklin's call for unity among the colonies, appropriate given the film's central message: a healthy democracy depends on citizens' sense of connection to each other, and that sense depends on participation in organizations of all kinds, from churches to bowling leagues. The decline of these groups, the film argues, is linked to plunging faith in our system of government."

I don't think it is a stretch to see the similarities with our Club. Putnam's research shows, "a 50% decline in the number of Americans who took any leadership role in any local organization and the number of times Americans attended a club meeting the previous year."

Putnam has told audiences, "your chances of dying over the next year are cut in half by joining one group."

So, am I saying you will die if you don't sign up for your service requirements or volunteer to be an officer? It can't hurt.

In the Foghorn this month, Vice Commodore **Bret Clark** shares the numbers of volunteer opportunities there are that you can sign up for—and maybe defer death.

## **Reminder-Bar Hosting**



Attention to all club members who wish to complete their club services as a Bar Host.

All bar hosts and/or anyone who checks ID's, serves alcohol, serves as a cashier, manages, or trains those who are responsible for alcohol-related duties, must complete a California State Responsible Beverage Service Training (RBS) course.

Your training course must include the successful completion of an Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) administered RBS exam. The certification requirements for AB 1221 must be renewed every 3 years.

You will find an RBS Training course from one of the Department-approved training providers online and must pass the Department's alcohol server certification exam with a 70% or better.

The California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) offers an online Responsible Beverage Service Portal! This portal provides access to all the tools you will need to ensure compliance with the mandatory RBS training requirements for Alcohol Servers, Licensees, and Training Providers.


